Take Raylene Amador, a Mecca Club alum. Since March 2022, BGC has been working tirelessly to create the Youth Mental Health Collaborative. This program addresses the juvenile mental health

Parents and educators are concerned about the extreme anxiety and depression experienced by young people due to the pandemic's impact on learning and the 18-month absence from peer-to-peer and teacher-student interactions. Last year at this time, staff was trained to discern and address signs of mental health issues. With the help of The Berger Foundation and The Houston Family Foundation, we hired case worker Hanna Thomas and licensed therapist Raylene Amador to evaluate and provide referral services to members and their families. Raylene is

the daughter of **Ray Amador**, our Mecca Club Unit Director, and was a BGC scholarship recipient. She earned a master's degree and now owns her own therapy practice. Raylene and Hanna will be refining the program along with *Innercare* to provide on-site therapists at our Clubs. We can't be prouder of this Club success story.

Every Step of the Way - It's Always About the Kids!
